

## Pushpay/ParishStaq Update

### We now have 22 "Campuses" involved in the Implementation Process!

Our Pilot Wave and Early Adopter Wave participants continue their implementation of ParishStaq.

Holy Family (Kirkland) has made great strides in inputting their facility and event calendars into the new platform. In addition, they will be launching PushPay online giving in the middle of November. They have also created numerous groups and have begun using some of the communication features. Their next focus is on creating and implementing process queues, one of which is automating 'New Parishioner Welcoming'.

**Sacred Heart (Battleground)** and its mission, **St. Joseph the Worker (Yacolt)**, are on a similar path of setting up facilities, events, and groups, and they have started work on the implementation of liturgy serving scheduling. They will use the LEAD app to facilitate check in of ministers prior to Masses. This will allow their sacristans to know who has arrived and be able to find substitutes easily, if needed.

The **Communications Department** at the Chancery is working with the PushPay coaches and app developers in planning for the custom app. They have had an initial training on the App Design Studio and continue planning its implementation. Much of their work will provide a structure for assets to be shared easily with the individual sites when they begin their app implementations. Their work will result in some base templates for easier implementation at the individual Churches during the onboarding process to the App Design Studio.

The **Early Adopter Waves 2 & 3** continue their learning and have covered how to add people, search for people, and edit people profiles. They have seen the recently released improvements related to Sacraments and the bulk Sacrament updating process.

For those who participated in much earlier demos of ParishStaq, the Sacrament section and functionality has undergone a tremendous improvement/evolution in the past 18 months! The developers are very proud of their work and the results speak for themselves. Next up for the Early Adopters group is learning related to Groups.

The **Archdiocesan Data Migration Team** is currently migrating all the people profiles and contribution history from PDS, ParishSoft, and eTapestry for the Early Adopters wave participants. This work is an incredibly important part of the implementation process and allows for in-depth cleaning and standardization of the many areas of data. As you can imagine, across these many individual databases, there is a wide range of data integrity.

The Data Team from ParishStaq commented: "This is the cleanest, easiest, data we've ever seen from a Catholic customer" and we are very proud of that! All the sites should also be proud as this is a result of all of the time invested in data cleanup. Keep up the good work for those sites still working on this!
